About The Ministry

OVERVIEW

We're an open-hearted community powerfully transforming our world by recognizing the sacred in all, and we're looking for an energetic leader who loves to engage with the congregation to join us in our mission and lead us to deeper understanding and spiritual growth. Our new minister will live and breathe the Unity principles and demonstrate the cultural sensitivity our diverse and growing community needs.

Our 43-acre hilltop site in the Texas Hill Country requires a minister as unique as it is—vibrant, open, and ready to let the special energy that's alive in this beautiful place influence his or her spiritual evolution. Our congregation is warm, joyful, heavily volunteer-driven, and we continue to grow and attract people from all ages and backgrounds.

We have an on-site business manager who provides "above and beyond" support for our minister, our services, group activities, and who manages our facilities and grounds so our minister can concentrate on community engagement and pastoral care. Several of our founding members still actively participate, and we have a large and engaged prayer chaplain team, vibrant YFM and YOU programs, a house band of award-winning professional musicians, a robust online presence, and well-attended live stream services.

We're a tithing church that regularly supports local food and shelter charities, participates in local LGBTQ+ events, and supports a wide variety of other charitable organizations and individuals in need across central Texas.

Locality:

Wimberley itself has a population of about 2500, but the Wimberley Valley has more than 15,000 residents, and our congregants also come to us from many other areas including Blanco, Buda, Kyle, San Marcos, and as far away as north Austin. Wimberley is a destination for visitors from all over Texas looking for beautiful countryside and a chance to enjoy the Square's shops and restaurants, monthly Market Days, and the nationally-recognized "swimming holes" of Jacob's Well Natural Area and Blue Hole Park. Wimberley is one of only 38 international Dark Sky-designated communities around the world committed to the preservation of the night sky through the implementation of a quality outdoor lighting ordinance, dark sky education, and citizen support of dark skies. We were also recently certified as a Music Friendly Community by the Texas Music Office. Many Grammy-winning singers, songwriters, and musicians call Wimberley home including Paul Simon, Kevin Fowler, and Ray Wiley Hubbard. The Wimberley city government strives to maintain the sleepy "secret" ambiance of the community, while advancing quiet and controlled growth. It really feels like we have it all when considering these charming qualities in the context of our location almost equidistant from the major metroplexes of Austin and San Antonio and their international airports.

Physical Description:

Wimberley itself sits among the hills of Central Texas in a tri-river basin known for its exceptional beauty. With its vineyards, olive groves, and dusty hills, it's a little bit of Tuscany in the heart of a state famous for other types of landscapes. Unity of Wimberley's campus is also unique. We have 43 acres on the top of a beautiful hill overlooking Lone Man Creek. Our campus includes an 8000 sq. ft. church, which used to be a private hunting lodge and has a full-professional kitchen, a one-bedroom apartment, guest quarters, multiple offices, meeting spaces, and a dedicated Youth Ministry space. The land includes miles of maintained walking trails, a labyrinth, an International Peace Pole, tennis courts, and a 2-acre wildlife garden recognized by MonarchWatch.com as a certified Monarch Butterfly Waystation. We hold and maintain a Texas state wildlife exemption on our property, as well.

VISION STATEMENT

We are an open-hearted spiritual community, powerfully transforming our world by honoring the sacred in all.

MISSION STATEMENT

Inspired by our shared spiritual awakening, we offer practical teachings that empower healthy, abundant and meaningful living.

What have been the three most important events in the history of your ministry?

- 1. 2005-2008: In 2005 we found the perfect permanent home for our church raising \$40,000 in 40 days from the congregation to secure the property from the seller for three years. In 2008 after being turned down by all the banks we approached, we created our own solution with the formation of our Church Family Ownership program that enabled our congregation to privately fund the purchase of the property. Over 40 congregants stepped up to purchase \$700,000 of debt. The program is still in effect today with more than 30 investors happily invested in a property that's nearly tripled in value since we bought it.
- 2. In 2007-2009: During a very difficult period of minster transition that brought significant conflict and pain, the core congregation used the Appreciative Inquiry Program to build a positive way forward. This led to attracting a great minister, music director, business manager and youth director. Since then, we've enjoyed 14 years of prosperous and joyful times. That core congregation is still at Unity of Wimberley today and has been joined by many more since.
- 3. 2020-2022: Our careful and targeted efforts to maintain and grow our community through the COVID pandemic. In spite of meeting remotely, we kept our congregation engaged spiritually and financially and expanded our outreach by ramping up the quality and quantity of our livestream and online presence. The result has been an almost complete return of our existing congregation and significant growth in new membership at a time when many other churches have closed their doors or continue to struggle.

In the last 3 years, what activities/special events in the ministry were all attended/appreciated?

- At the end of 2021, an outdoor holiday party was our first in-person gathering since we'd implemented COVID restrictions. We had a food truck, live music, caroling, games for the kids and more than 80 members attended. The love and enthusiasm in the air was palpable.
- In the spring of 2022, our men's group organized and worked a spring picnic with kids' games, pickleball demonstrations, live music and culminated in amazing drum circle around our International Peace Pole led by a congregant who is a native American shaman.
- In October 2022, our first 3-day Women's Retreat was held after a two-year COVID hiatus. It was completely congregant-led, as our current minister was on sabbatical. With more than 40 women in attendance at a nearby Hill Country religious retreat center, the program included music, crystal bowl-accompanied meditation, chanting and yoga, a native American lore/ritual class, and an abundance/manifesting workshop taught by a congregant/life coach

What does the congregation want to accomplish in the next 3 years?

- Helping our new minister find his or her feet quickly and comfortably.
- Continuing to develop the sociographic and demographic breadth of our congregation.
- Enhancing our already robust financial stability in a post-COVID world.

POWER OF FOCUSED MINISTRY

WHO does this ministry serve?

We're a small and growing church with a demographically- and sociographically-diverse community some of whose members come from as far away as Austin to San Antonio, in spite of the availability of other Unity churches closer to home. At Unity of Wimberley, we're not a church in name only. Service to each other and the greater community drives everything we do. Our congregants come from all walks of life looking for an inclusive, spirit-based way of being, thinking and doing. In some circles, the Wimberley Valley has been described as an energy vortex with a strong spiritual attraction. Our congregation is an interesting reflection of this unique location—a valley full of highly-educated, sophisticated, nature-focused, artistic and musical people who are strongly community-focused and looking for strong human connection.

WHY do you exist as a ministry?

To fill a gap that traditional religious institutions in our area haven't been able to fill. Led by love in all things, our goal is to nourish our congregation spiritually, emotionally and, often, physically to create lifetime connections we don't find anywhere else and to offer that gift to others looking for the same thing. We're inclusive, non-dogmatic, open-minded, and open-hearted—aware that there are many paths to God and each person's is highly individual. To be able to provide spiritual direction and sustenance in a way that nurtures all of these paths is at the heart of our ministry.

What demographic resonates to the answer of your WHY question?

Older congregants make up about half of the membership and sustain us financially and with their wisdom and incredibly consistent volunteer energy. Young families consistently find us a vital alternative to traditional churches. We get to enjoy the glorious gurglings of infants during Sunday Service, and every Sunday we "sing in our kids" as our youth program members, from toddlers to college-age, parade in at the end of the service to receive the congregation's welcome and blessing. We're proud to say our Board reflects the same age diversity, and we consider the wisdom of age and the forward-thinking shot of energy and perspective of our younger members to be a potent combo for taking our church forward successfully.

Describe your vision of the perfect ministry.

Our new minister will share our vision of inclusivity and be passionately excited to use their unique skills and spiritual expertise to keep expanding what we've built so far at Unity of Wimberley. Our perfect minister will help us grow by word and by example. They'll help us seek new paths to God and know how to clear away the brush on the existing ones. Together, we support our congregation spiritually, emotionally, and sometimes physically, and we have fun doing it. Our new minister will love jumping into this pool of compassion, humor, and love with both feet.

Housing market, school districts, etc., in your locale:

According to www.payscale.com, In Wimberley itself housing expenses are 4% lower than the national average and the utility prices are 2% lower than the national average. Median home price is \$380,864. Median rent is \$1,163. Wimberley has grocery prices that are 14% lower than the national average and healthcare is on par with the national average. In the 2020-2021 school year, Wimberley Independent School District had 2,560 students in its two recently-built elementary schools, and its middle and high schools. Blue Hole Primary School is the first "One Water" designated school in Texas, exclusively using rainwater collection and recycling to maintain the school and including the importance of rainwater collection and water conservation in its curriculum. Wimberley High School has 849 students and received an accountability rating of A for the 2020-2021 school year. In the Class of 2020, 100% of students received their high school diplomas on time or earlier. The average SAT score at Wimberley ISD was 1154 for 2019-2020 graduates. The average ACT score was 24.4. Alternatively, Wimberley's Katherine Anne Porter School is a free, public, charter high school serving students grades 9-12. As an open enrollment Charter, KAPS welcomes students from Wimberley and many surrounding areas. With small classes and a focus on individual learners, it aims to provide a meaningful educational experience and welcoming, inclusive community many traditional high schools may not offer. Other area private schools include San Marcos Baptist Academy in San Marcos (K-12), and St. Stephen's Episcopal School (Pre-K-6), Blanco River Academy Middle School (5-9), and Wimberley Montessori (Pre K-8), which are all in Wimberley.
